Please find below a **draft** schedule for the technical visits that Professor Peng is organising in Beijing. This schedule may change depending on the number of people who are able to participate.

28 April

- Go to Tianjin, visiting Huaneng IGCC (integrated gasification combined cycle) Power Plant Demonstration Project, operated by China Huaneng Group, China's largest and only national state-owned power generating company.
- In Beijing, visiting the clean energy key laboratory of China Shenhua Group, a state-owned mining and energy company in China. It is also the largest coal-producing company in the world.

29 April

- Go to Zhangjiakou city, visiting China's first renewable energy pilot zone. This city is situated in northwest Hebei Province and will hold the 2022 Beijing Winter Olympic Games hand in hand with Beijing.

30 April

- In Beijing, discussions on the future of China's energy development with Chinese experts as well as government officials related with energy engineering and technologies.
- In Beijing, visiting the CAE and meeting with the leaders of CAE.
